<p>Organization</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> The argument is clear, supported by evidence, and easily summarized by the listener <input type="checkbox"/> All of the elements of the discussion are understood and information is added in a clear structured way <input type="checkbox"/> The speaker can clearly explain the evidence and data (including graphs, charts, diagrams, and other visual elements) where necessary 					
<p>Vocabulary and Phrasing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Command of the necessary vocabulary, including technical terms and collocations <input type="checkbox"/> Precise vocabulary demonstrates a particular knowledge of the topic, and helps the listener to understand difficult terms by fully elaborating 					
<p>Flow</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Use of discourse markers / signposts (however, therefore, nevertheless) create flow <input type="checkbox"/> All discourse markers are used correctly and grammatically <input type="checkbox"/> It is clear that the speaker has practiced ahead of time to facilitate clear communication 					
<p>Grammar</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> All verbs are conjugated correctly, with care given to subject + verb agreement and irregulars <input type="checkbox"/> Word order is correct in all sentences <input type="checkbox"/> The correct preposition is used in all situations 					
<p>Pronunciation and Delivery</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> The pronunciation is clear and understandable for listeners from all language backgrounds <input type="checkbox"/> The delivery (rate of speaking) is slow and clear enough for others to understand <input type="checkbox"/> The speaker communicates ideas clearly and directly with limited “fillers” such as “um,” “er” and “uh”
