Organization <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> The argument is clear, supported by evidence, and easily summarized by the reader <input type="checkbox"/> All of the elements of the text are present and organized appropriately (introduction, methods, results, conclusions, thesis statement, purpose, etc.) <input type="checkbox"/> The author follows a clear, linear organization <input type="checkbox"/> Data is fully integrated into the text, with clear elaboration 					
Vocabulary and Phrasing <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Command of the necessary vocabulary, including technical terms and collocations <input type="checkbox"/> Precise vocabulary demonstrates a particular knowledge of the topic, and helps the reader to understand difficult terms by fully elaborating 					
Flow <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Use of discourse markers / signposts (however, therefore, nevertheless) create flow <input type="checkbox"/> All discourse markers are used correctly and grammatically 					
Verb use <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Passive voice is used in the right contexts, and careful attention is paid to word order <input type="checkbox"/> Verb tenses are used in the correct sections to communicate methods, findings, etc. <input type="checkbox"/> All verbs are conjugated correctly, with care given to subject + verb agreement and irregulars 					
Mechanics <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> The capitalization, punctuation, spelling, paragraphing, and other mechanics are in order 					
Citing and Paraphrasing (literature review, quotations, referring to other authors' work) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> The author clearly sums up other texts through citing and paraphrasing <input type="checkbox"/> The author locates the present text within the field of literature 					
Formality <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> The author avoids casual writing style, such as contractions (don't, haven't, etc.), starting sentences with coordinating conjunctions (but, yet, so, etc.) <input type="checkbox"/> The author writes appropriately to the level of formality (avoiding I and we where appropriate, not using emotional words, clearly separating fact from opinion, etc.)
